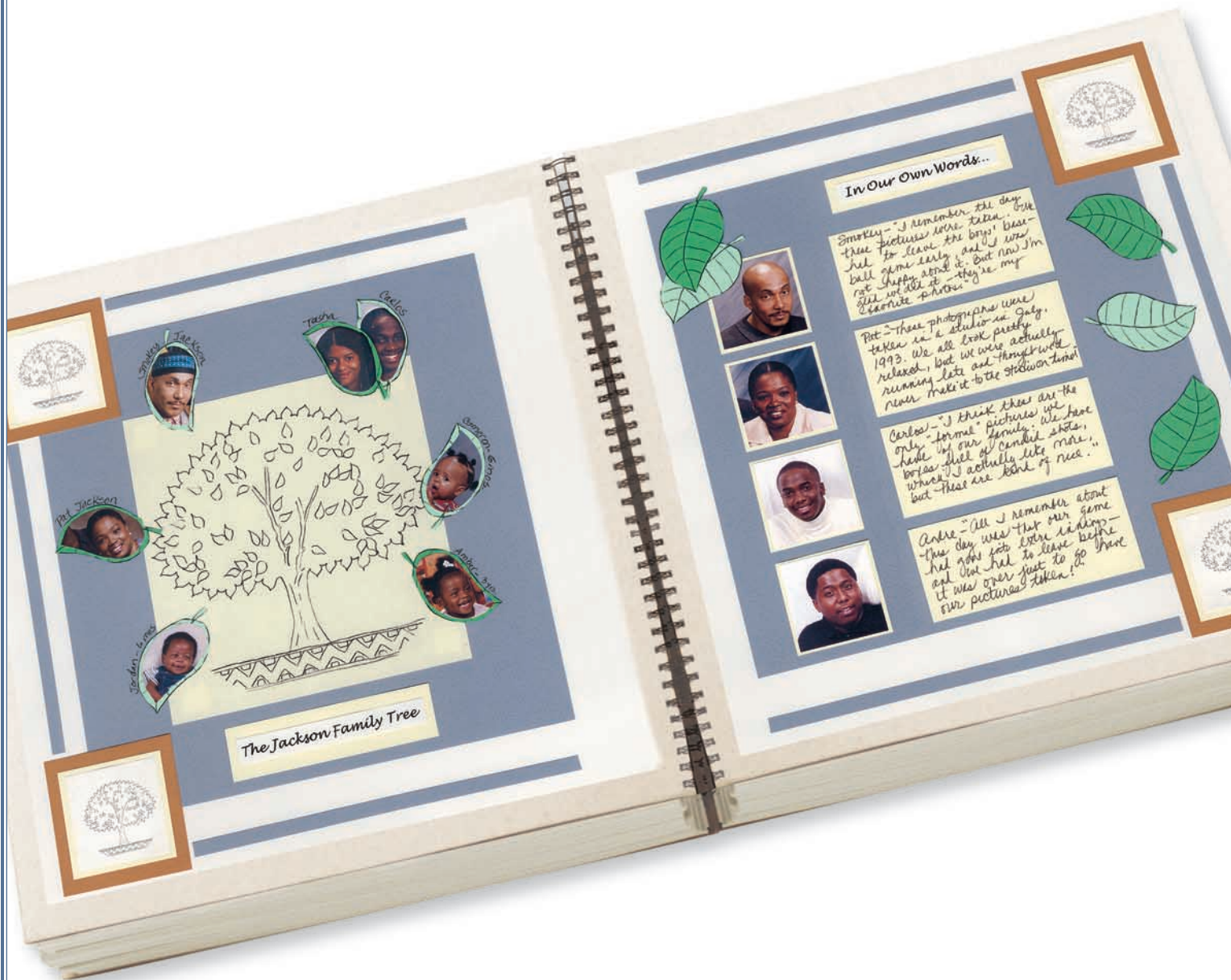


Family Tree



In Our Own Words...

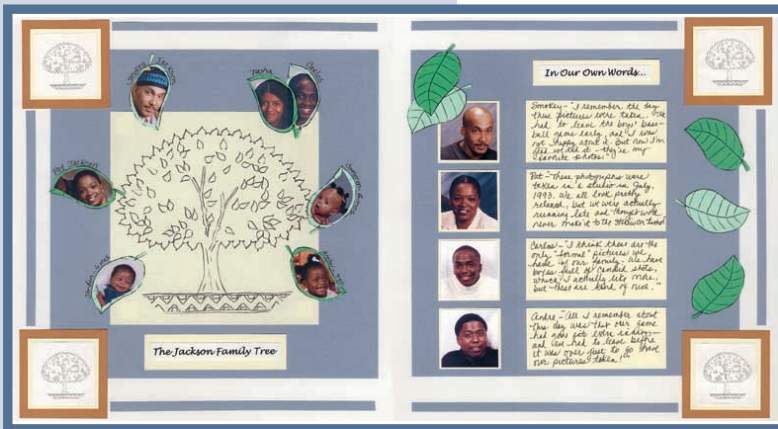

AMERICAN FAMILY ALBUM



You Will Need:

- Album pages*
- Colored background sheet*
- #2 Pencil
- Ruler
- Photo-safe glue stick
- Photographs (copies)*
- Scissors or craft knife
- Tree motif (provided here or your own)
- 2 Coordinating solid-colored papers*
- 2 Green colored papers (for leaves)
- Sheet protector

Instructions

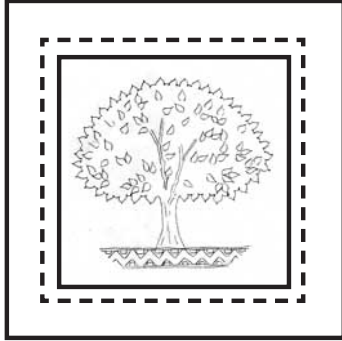
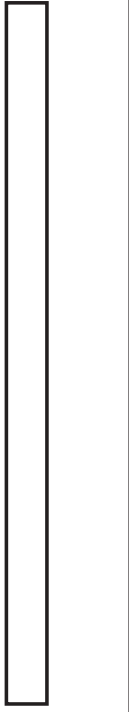
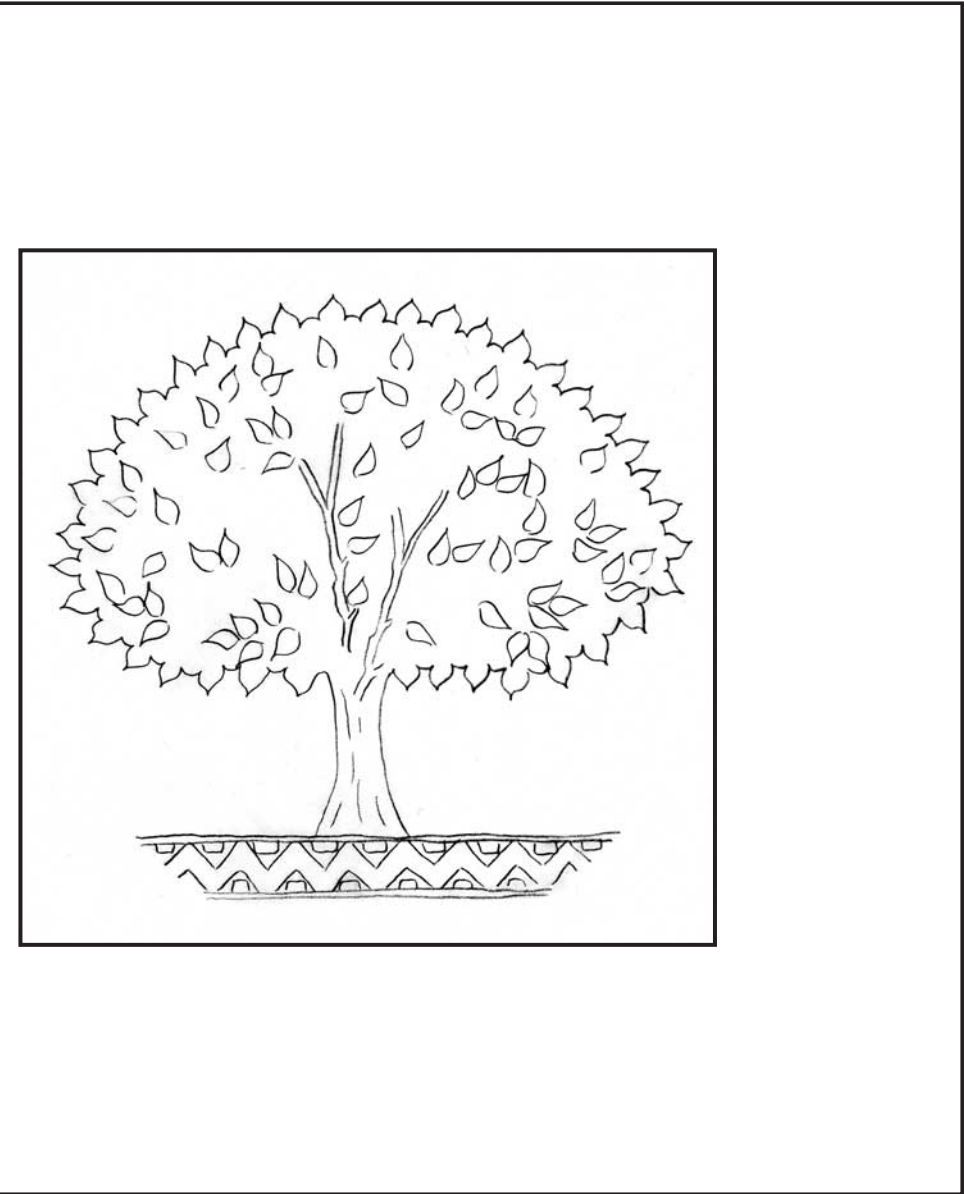
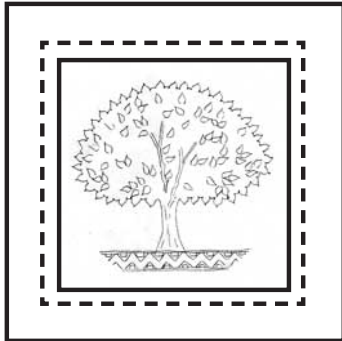
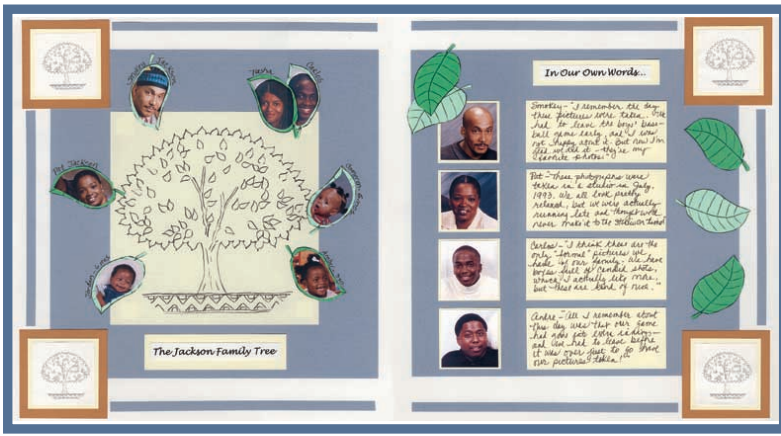
1. Use a photocopier to enlarge this pattern to fit your album page or follow the transfer directions given in the main document.
2. Cut 2 background squares to pattern piece 1.
3. Using the same color, cut the borders using pieces 2 & 3. (4 each of #2, 2 each of #3)
4. Using 2 coordinating colored papers, cut 4 squares (piece 4) from one paper and 4 squares (piece 5) from the second paper. Glue the smaller square on top of the larger square, forming a layered mat.
5. Using the leaf pattern pieces, cut several leaves from each color. Draw the vein lines in pen on the leaf shapes.
6. Cut a big tree for your central image. Cut 4 small trees for the corners and glue them to the layered mats from step 4.
7. Arrange the left side page: glue the background square, center tree, borders, and corner trees to your page.
8. Use the same number of leaves as photos of family members. Trim the photos so they are slightly smaller than the leaf shapes (leaving a border around them). Glue the photos to the leaves, and the leaves to the page surrounding the tree.
9. On the right side page, glue the background square, borders, and corner trees as you did in step 7.
10. Use the center of the right side page for more formal photos, and journaling. You can include quotations from each member, favorite qualities, and/or important information (e.g., birthday and birthplace, date of death and where, date of marriage and to whom).
11. Decorate the right side page with additional leaves.
12. Adhere background sheet to album page.
13. Insert your finished page into your sheet protector. Now you're ready to place it in your album!

* Acid-free products are recommended.

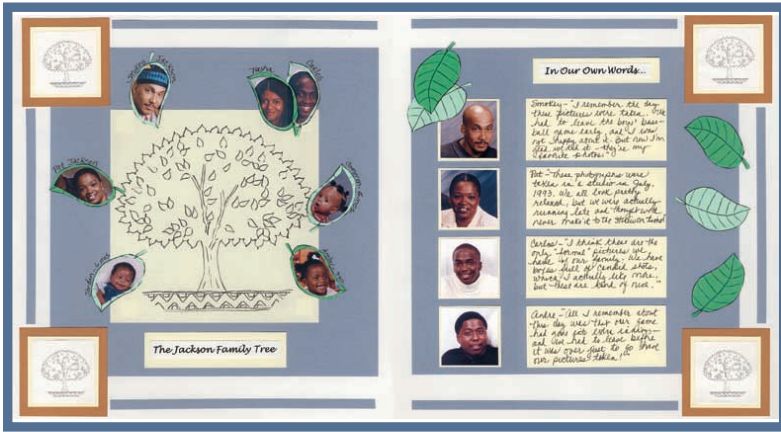
Pattern
