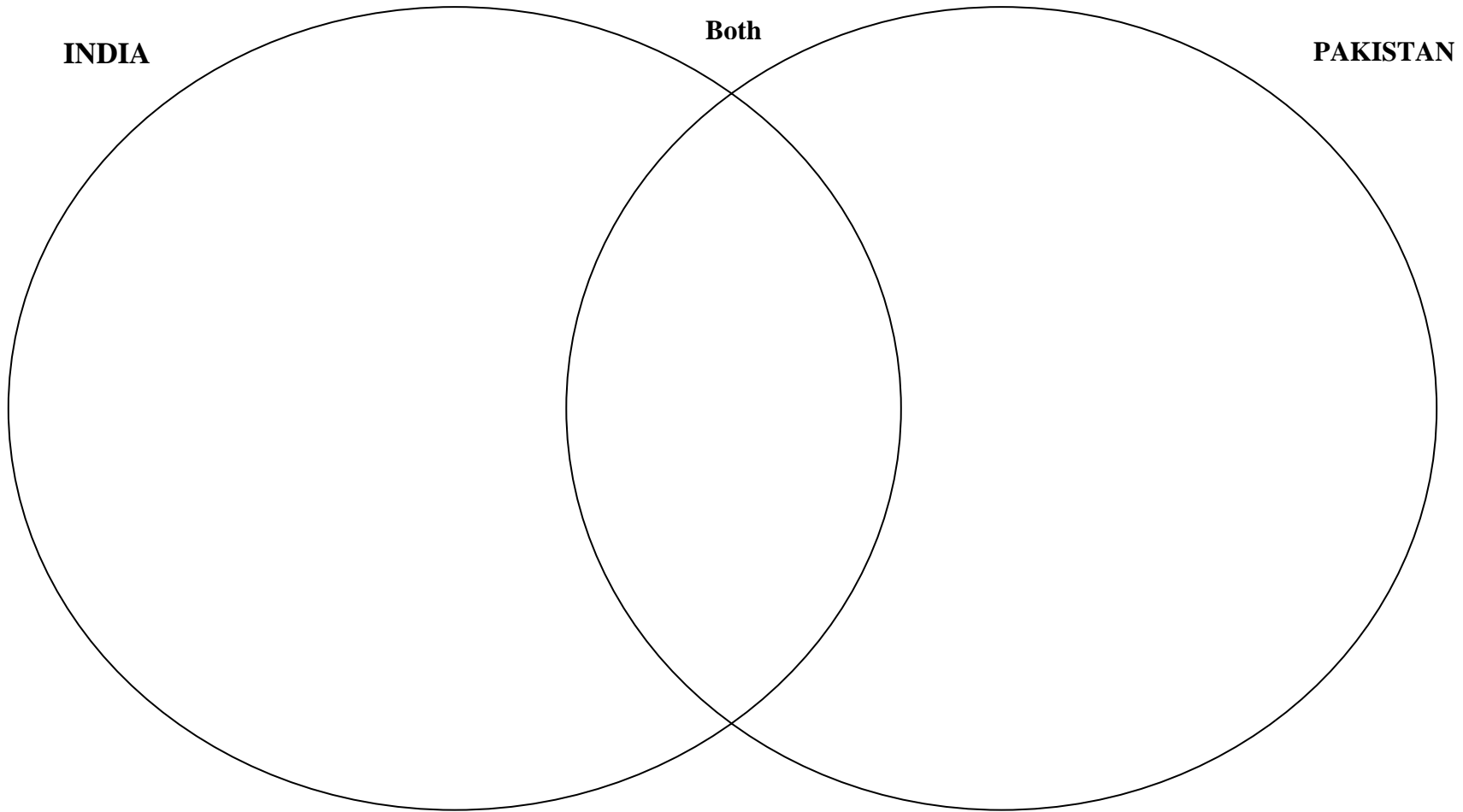


VENN DIAGRAM: INDIA AND PAKISTAN - Student Resource 'A'

Directions: Place the following facts pertaining to India and Pakistan in the designated spaces. If the facts relate to both Pakistan and India, place in the center section.



Previously ruled by the British
Islamabad is the capital
Considered the world's largest democracy
Claims the region of Kashmir
Islam is the predominant religion
Possesses nuclear weapons
The name derives from Urdu word meaning *pure*
Uses the rupee as its currency
Borders Afghanistan
Formed as a secular nation
Touches the Arabian Sea

The population has surpassed one billion
In area, one-third the size of the U.S.
Karachi is the largest city
Contains the Ganges River
The Indus River flows through this country
Situated on a subcontinent
Predominantly Hindu
Fast rising middle class
Divided into a West and East segment in 1947
President is General Pervez Musharraf
Historically part of the Mogul Empire
Bordered by Iran to the West

Twice the size of California
Received independence in 1947
Contains K2, the second highest peak in the world
New Delhi is the capital city
Muslims make-up approximately 13% of population
One of the fastest growing economies in the world
Neighbors include Nepal and Bhutan
Commemorating 60 years of independence
Borders the Bay of Bengal
Muhammad Ali Jinnah, -known as the Great Leader
Contains varied landscapes: mountains, deserts,
coastal areas, plateaus and plains
